
IBF Malaysia International Business Forum


Member's Corner

HOLIDAY TRAFFIC JAMS ARE **OUR OWN DOING**

During festive periods with extended holidays, headlines such as "Heavy traffic on expressways" normally appear. This is something to be expected.

But this time around the traffic jam increased multifold, causing so much frustration and anger to travelers. What happened? The simple answer is that the traffic jam was our own doing; we created the problem.

As part of its corporate social responsibility, the North-South Expressway (NSE) and the East Coast Expressway (ECE) implemented toll-free rates for the weekends prior to and after Hari Raya Yes, the kind gesture was appreciated by the rakyat, but it also created fresh problems that erased the toll-free benefits.




The timing of the toll-free rates was not in line with what a transport economist would have recommended. It is common in the transportation sector to impose higherrates during peak hours to reduce congestion. It is meant to encourage road users who can be flexible with their usage to shift away from peak periods. But the NSE and ECE did just the opposite.

By encouraging more motorists to take advantage of the toll-free rate, they exacerbated the situation This worsened the peak-period congestion and created more problems, such as a shortage of petrol at highway stations. The associated costs if computed are also high. The extra fuel burnt due to the slow-moving traffic meant that air pollution increased correspondingly. What about the wear and tear of vehicles? And the loss of man-hours idling in traffic jams?

There is also the human factor. Motorist can attest to the fact that it can be frustrating when caught in long jams. Tiredness sets in. The stress on drivers, including their loved ones cooped up in the vehicle, is also high. Express bus operators must have been mad as they could have only fewer trips per day.

We learnt from Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob that the Transport Ministry, Works Ministry, Malaysian Highway Authority and highway operators had long- term plans to overcome traffic congestion during festive periods.

This is welcome news. Highway operators are free to give motorists something to cheer about during festive periods, but the timing must be right.

The idea is to smoothen or level off the traffic curve (to redistribute the traffic) by applying toll-free rates during non-peak hours, such as midnight to 6am a few days before and after.


